Deadlines

Due Friday, April 28th, before class:

- a. E-mail the author of the 2nd cut and ask him/her to respond to your RQ; cc me on this message.
- b. Reply to whatever question you get and & cc me on that message, too.

Due Friday, May 5th, in class:

Find 2 new sources on your topic that are:

- a. secondary—that is, library books written by historians
- b. in disagreement with each other over your RQ.

Bring in photocopies of a page from each book, highlighting the passages where they disagree over your RQ.

Hints on finding useful secondary sources:

- a. Brinkley lists many secondary books at the end of every chapter under “For Further Reference.” Take a look.

- b. There is a link on the RUSH website to the catalogue of Green Library, the main undergraduate library at Stanford. So you can check to see what they have on your topic before you head over there.

Due Monday, May 8th, in class:

Turn in all of the following:

- a. a cover sheet listing your name, the date, and the most current approved version of your Research Question.
- b. photocopies of two different historians’ *contrasting* opinions on your RQ, with the most relevant passages highlighted. Both must be from published books, not websites.
- c. on a separate sheet, an annotated bibliography. This is where you do two things for each of your sources: (i) cite it the way you would in a bibliography (NOT the same as an endnote!), and (ii) explain in 2-3 sentences of your own words how the source sheds light on your RQ. Do the two sources disagree about the facts? Or do they interpret the same facts differently?
